Subject: Immunization Against Influenza

Dear Friends and Colleagues:

As you are well aware, influenza can be deadly, particularly to the very young and very old populations. Especially to those whose health is already compromised by illness or frail health.

In an effort to curb the transmission of influenza by providers, teachers, staffs and anyone with close person-to-person contact with a patient, student or client, we, as Medical Society members and Health Department officials, strongly support the policy that all such persons in the workforce be vaccinated against influenza * in the interest of public health. Even to the point of adopting immunization against influenza as a condition of

employment. (Dr. Jeffrey Engel, State Director of Public Health stated, in a conversation on September ninth, that nursing homes, for instance, may, legally, mandate immunization for employees.)

Understanding, full well, that many of you have already given employees numerous incentives for immunization or adopted immunization as a condition of employment, we petition you: Please put into practice all reasonable measures to rally behind the effort to immunize against influenza. We look forward to receiving word of any implementation guidelines that you are able to achieve.
